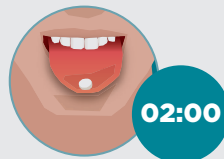

How to take Jorveza tablets

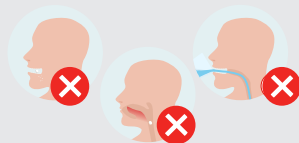
Jorveza contains budesonide, a medicine used to treat eosinophilic oesophagitis (EoE). It comes in 0.5 mg and 1 mg strengths. Jorveza is a special type of tablet called an orodispersible that you slowly dissolve on your tongue. It mixes with your saliva then coats your oesophagus with the medicine as you gradually swallow. To get the most from Jorveza, please follow these instructions carefully. If you have any questions, please ask your doctor or pharmacist for advice.

Simply place Jorveza on the tip of your tongue, then gently press it against the roof of your mouth while it dissolves.

It should take about 2 minutes for the Jorveza tablet to dissolve completely.



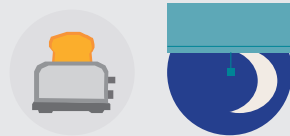
You should not chew Jorveza, or swallow it undissolved, or take it with liquid.



After that, it's very important that you give Jorveza time to work. So, at the very least, leave 30 minutes before eating, drinking, cleaning your teeth or chewing gum.



It may help to take Jorveza after you have had your breakfast and brushed your teeth in the morning and very last thing at night, just as you go to bed. That way medicine will stay in contact with your oesophagus for as long as possible.
